
KILHAM PLAYGROUP

Hedgehog News

Thank you to Sarah Worton, for rescuing a 'Very Ill' Hedgehog in Burton Fleming. Unfortunately this very poorly hedgehog had been damaged in a 'Strimming incident' and had to be put to sleep as he was in dreadful pain.



ADVICE ON WHAT TO DO FOR A HEDGEHOG FRIENDLY VILLAGE

As well as providing access to roam, here are some other things to do to help hedgehogs;

- Please could you ensure when feeding hedgehogs in the summer that you supply LOTS OF WATER!
- Before using a strimmer, make sure the area to cut is clear
- For a couple of days after applying wood preservative at ground level, protect your work from hedgehogs who like to lick it! It makes them very poorly.
- Stop or reduce the amount of pesticides and poisons used.
- Move piles of rubbish to a new site before burning them.
- Ensure netting is kept at a safe height.
- Check compost heaps before digging a fork in.
- Cover drains and deep holes.
- Ensure there is an easy route out of ponds and pools.
- A hedgehog lying in the sun wobbling as it walks or with flies around it needs help. Use a gardening glove to collect it up, bring it indoors in a cardboard box and cover with an old fleece or towel. Call Ali (07734053699) or Jo Pickering (East Yorkshire Hedgehog Rescue) from Langtoft (07717552624) who rescues hedgehogs and rehabilitates them ready for release.



Dear Friends
