
KILHAM PLAYGROUP



A FEW WORDS FROM ME

Dear Friends,

I've been thinking quite a bit about oaths & promises. How often we make them and how often we fail to keep them.

The oath & promises that the King swore during his coronation were like many of the other kinds of oaths or promises that are made in churches - such as the promise to live a life lived in the love of God made by those about to be baptised (or by the parents and godparents of a child), or the promises that couples make during a marriage service to love one another for better, for worse, for richer, for poorer and in sickness and in health.

When we make a promise to God we are promising that we will do the very best we can to keep that promise, although there will often be times when we may need God's help to keep them.

The most important king, of course, is the King of Heaven! Holy Communion is a reminder that we should all try to live our lives as Jesus did, helping the poor, the sick and the lonely, reaching out to those who have been excluded and oppressed. It reminds us that we are all equal in the eyes of God, we are all blessed by him, regardless of how important we may think we are.

So, may we also be reminded of the promises that we have made ourselves to those around us, we can remember that God's presence is always with us and we can be inspired to live up to our calling to serve others and reach out to those who need help, support and care. Have a happy June,
