## ORDERING PRESCRIPTIONS

Some people may have been concerned recently to hear the recorded message when phoning the Surgery that they no longer take prescription requests over the phone. This has been the case for about four years and is the case for most surgeries. This message was put out recently because there had been issues where patients could not get through with urgent requests due to the amount of patients trying to order over the phone. Generally, patients should order their prescriptions either online or by dropping off their request slips at the surgery. However, please be assured that Hunmanby Surgery would never refuse to take a request on the telephone from a vulnerable patient. A message is written on the record of those patients who are unable to order any other way.

OVER THE COUNTER MEDICATIONS- taken from a notice from North Yorkshire CCG

From 1 October all GPs will no longer routinely prescribe medicines for minor health conditions. It is easy to get advice and medicines from your pharmacy without a prescription and no appointment is needed. This will save the NHS a lot of money and also free up appointments for patients with more serious conditions. Your pharmacist can advise you on how long you can expect to experience symptoms for the conditions and they are also trained to signpost you to the right medical care if you have something more serious.
