Hedgehog favourite food:

- Dried kitten biscuits- No fish flavour please (Kitten is easier for hoglets)
- Spikes semi moist hedgehog food
- Wet cat food in jelly - No fish flavour please
- Dried mealworms in very small amounts
- LOTS OF WATER!



If you see any size hedgehogs, out during the day, it usually means they are in distress so please seek advice straight away. DO NOT wait and observe as time is critical for their recovery. Please call either myself, Ali (07734053699) or Jo Pickering from Langtoft (07717552624) who rescues hedgehogs and rehabilitates them ready for release.

Please remember to check for hedgehogs prior to gardening, especially strimming and grass cutting.

Please note that this application is to vary the drainage only.

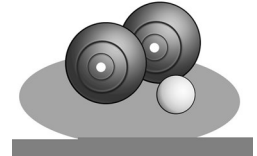

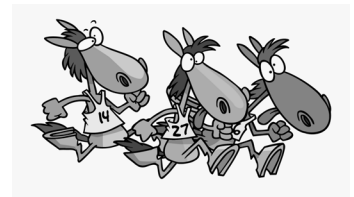

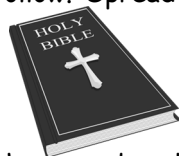

Dear Friends,

Have you ever gone to the supermarket and then got home and realised that you've forgotten what you went for!! We humans are very easily distracted and very forgetful, especially when we are tired. If we are tired, we can sometimes feel like we don't have the energy to pray or to go to Church - even though neither really ask that much of us.
